Have at least three Aspects/Moods:

- Active
- Passive
- Conjunctive

Dynamic Verbs

Verb extensions:

- Causative
- Benefactive
- Ablative
- Allative

Transitivity

- Often only impacts syntax (constituent ordering) but templates may be required if the structure of the verb itself is affected.
- If the changes to the verb morphology are slight consider adapting templates to work with all transitivity types, i.e. object

Inflectional Classes or Declensions

 The verbs in Nyangatom can be divided into two Inflectional Classes. (Each has a different set of subject marker prefixes.)

- TO -class
- KI -class

Examples of TO and KI Classes

TO-class

akeri ayongo ikeri iyongo ekeri nges<u>i</u> ekerio suwa ekerio ngon<u>i</u> ikerete tas<u>i</u> ekerete kech<u>i</u>

I run you/SG run he/she runs we (excl.) run we (incl.) run you/PL run they run

<u>KI-class</u>

emuji ayongo imuji iyongo imuji nges<u>i</u> imujio suwa imujio ngon<u>i</u> imujete tas<u>i</u> imujete kech<u>i</u>

you/SG eat he/she eats

I eat

we (excl.) eat we (incl.) eat

we (men.) ea

you/PL eat

they eat
